as a representative of the Free Software movement we – the Free Software Foundation Europe – herewith apply for third-party status in the ongoing investigation of the EU Commission towards Microsoft. We believe that our long and broad experience in the software field will enable us to contribute to this investigation.

The Free Software movement and the software market

Free Software, and in particular the GNU/Linux operating system (the GNU system with the Linux kernel added), now holds a substantial and increasing share of the operating system market. Microsoft cited this system as its principal competitor and is using various methods to attack the Free Software movement. These attacks are usually performed using monopolistic practices similar to those used in the conventional software market.

We believe that some of Microsoft's methods of attack are against free competition, and should be investigated by the EU Commission.
